The Knox Community Christmas Support (KCCS) "Sharing the Joy" Appeal aims to reach families or individuals in need of a hamper of festive food and a selection of quality gifts for children and teenagers. The KCCS Appeal has assisted 5,523 people within the City of Knox experiencing financial hardship since 2010.

Christmas can be a difficult time for families to pay bills as well as buying food and presents. This is especially true for people on a low income as a result of unemployment, reduced work hours, fragile mental or physical health, increasing housing costs, the rising cost of living and arriving to Australia as a refugee or asylum seeker.

2021 was another challenging year with its ever changing environment, living in a Covid safe world. We would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the tireless work that Wayne Guest has done over the past several years. We thank you for building this appeal to what it is today and we will carry the reins this year to keep moving forward. The KCCS Appeal has 7 Community organisations (Working Group) that
